And what is the exceeding greatness of his power to us ward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him. from the dead. the third day according to the Scriptures, I Cor. 15:3, 4. For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the Scriptures. for our justification, Rom. 4. 25. Who was delivered for our offences and was raied again for our justification. for his Churchs Colt L.T.PVX
